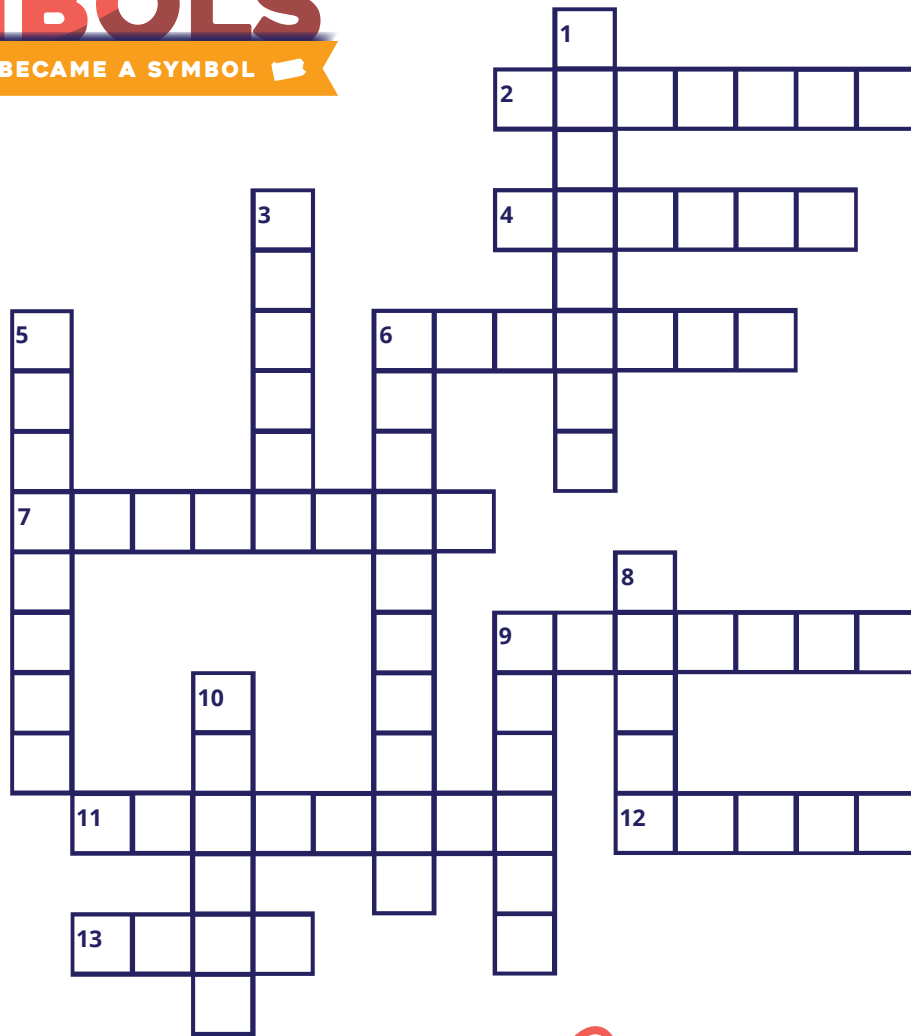




# SYMBOLS
