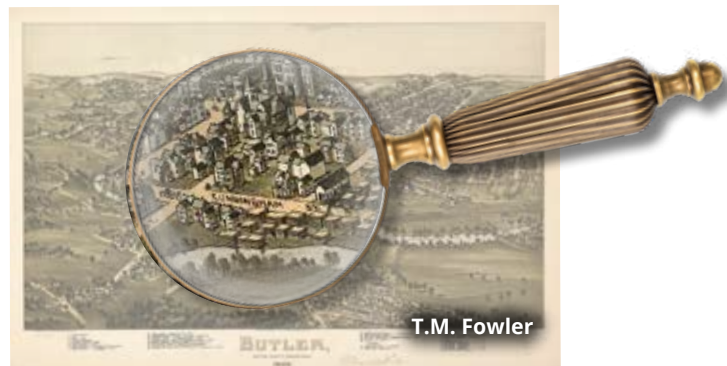

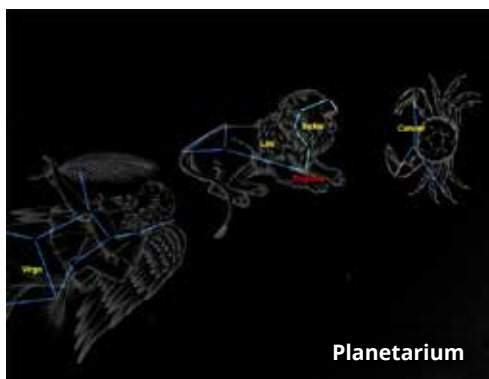


Pennsylvania Habitats: Art and Nature in Mammal Hall
