# I-BUILT-O-SAUROUS!

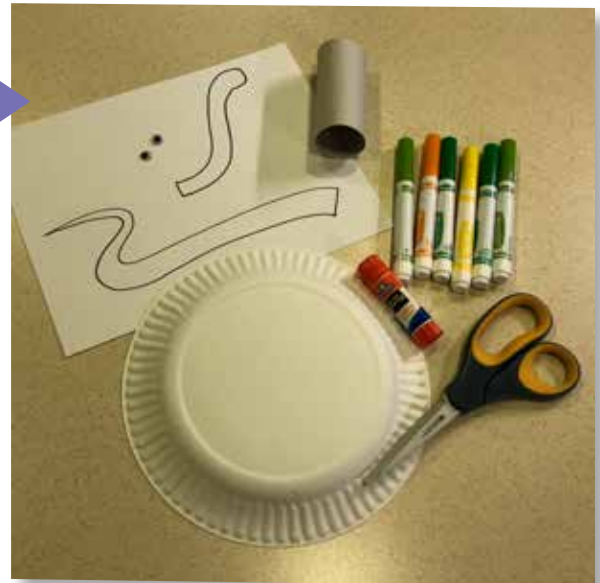
## ACTIVITY SHEET

Dinosaurs were reptiles that lived millions of years ago. The largest animals to ever live on Earth were a type of dinosaur called Sauropods. There were many different types of Sauropods like Camarasaurus, Brachiosaurus, Diplodocus, and Apatosaurus. Sauropods could differ in length, height, and weight. However, Sauropods were similar in that they all had very long necks and very long tails, small heads, and walked on four thick legs. Sauropods were also herbivores, meaning they ate plants. Try making your own Sauropod! Be sure to give your Sauropod a name like Ibuiltasaurus!

## INSTRUCTIONS

### STEP 1: GATHER YOUR MATERIALS

Paper Plate • Toilet Paper Roll  
Head and Tail Template  
(Printed on cardstock) • Scissors  
Markers/Crayons/Paint  
(whatever you want to use to color your dinosaur)  
Quick Dry Glue  
Optional: Two small googly eye stickers



## INSTRUCTIONS

### STEP 2: PREPARE YOUR PARTS

- Print the head and tail template on card stock. Color both sides and cut them out.

Note: A set of googly eyes (one on each side of the head) is a cute addition, but you can always just draw eyes too.

- Color the paper plate and fold the plate in half.
- Cut the toilet paper roll in half to make two legs.
- Cut two slits opposite each other to receive the paper plate. Color the legs.

### STEP 3: ASSEMBLING YOUR SAUROPOD

- Glue the head and tail into each end of your folded paper plate while glueing the two halves of the plate together.
- Insert plate into the cut slits of your toilet paper rolls.

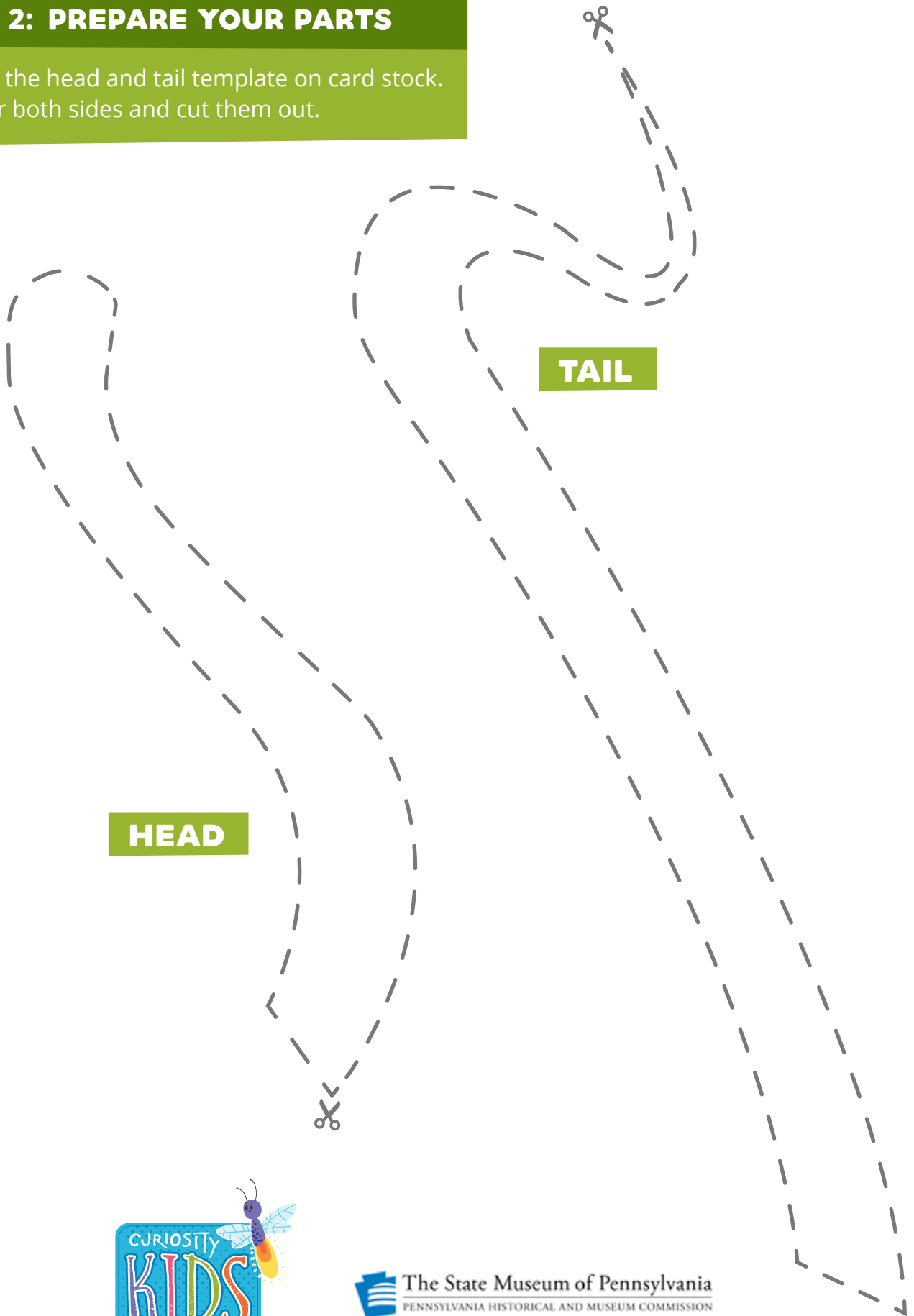


You created a Sauropod dinosaur! What did you name your Sauropod?



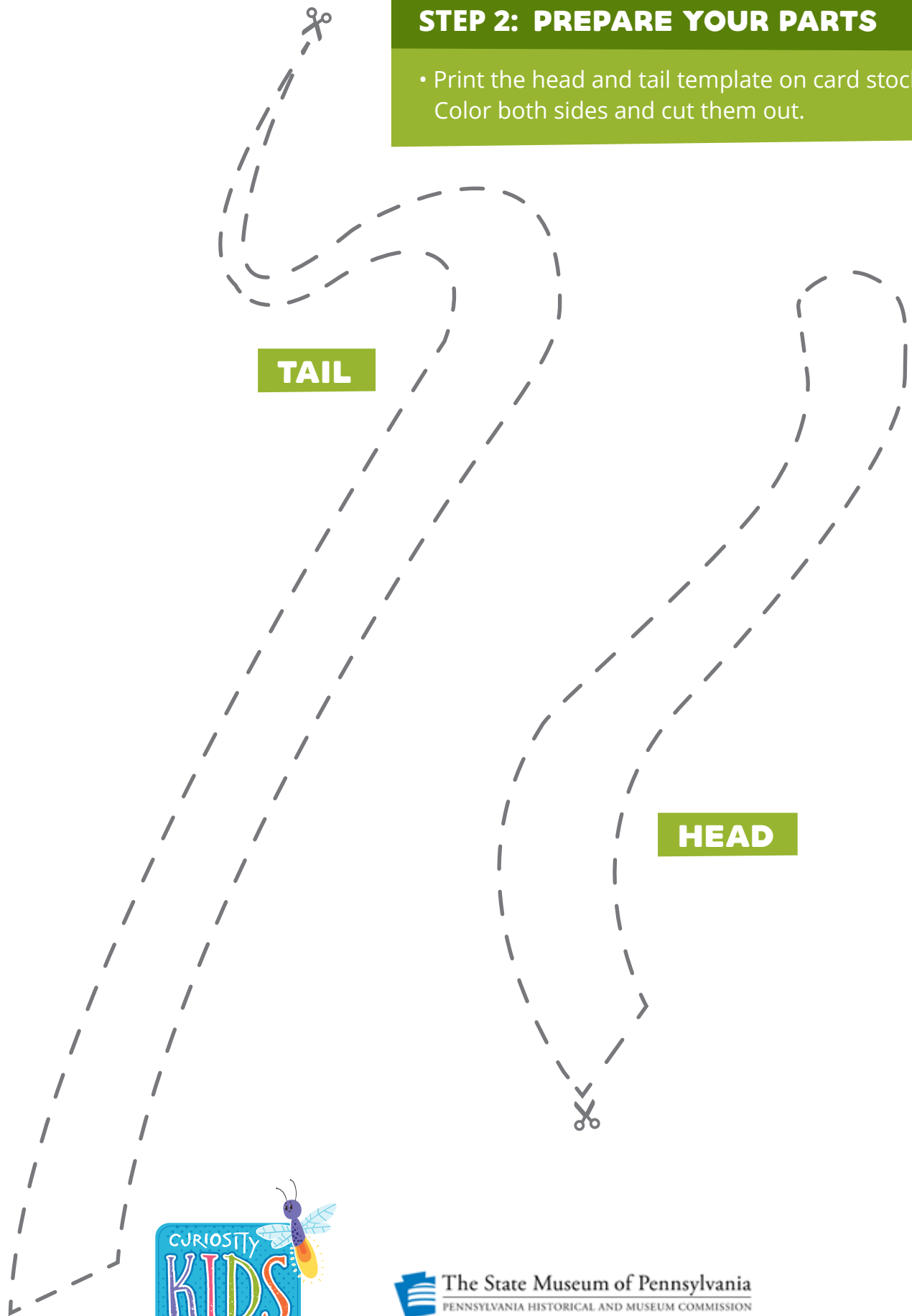
