STATEMENT:

My current body of work is inspired by the seed germination process known as, "breaking dormancy" and how this relates to my experience of personal growth. Breaking dormancy is a phrase which refers to the phenomena in plant development in which seeds with particularly tough coatings are not able to germinate. This occurs even under favorable environmental conditions, unless this coating is weakened or removed. I interpret this idea as being self-protective to one's own detriment. My work shows the dualities of protection and restraint and how these things relate to a desire to shed restrictions. A sense of vulnerability lies at the center of this protection and is shown to often be something that is obscured or unavailable without effort from the viewer. The materials I incorporate become integral to the work because of their relationship to these concepts and each other. Thinly networked glass indicates a personal fragility when combined with objects typically worn on the body, whereas the spalted wood in many of my pieces shows a physical manifestation of boundaries and restriction. In defiance of the constant appearance of self-control, this body of work consistently displays an emergence of growth and self-expression.

STATEMENT:

I am inspired by the dramatic landscapes of the Badlands National Park in South Dakota and by the seascapes of the West/East Coast. The raw landscapes span layered rock formations, steep canyons, towering spires, sheer cliffs, and coastal tidal ecosystems. Much of any landscape's or seascape's magnificence comes from the banded coloring of the minerals found in the stratified hillsides that often yield fossilized dinosaur bones and shells. The shifting colors of the hills and cliffs that change from dawn until dusk under dramatic skies lit by natural phenomena such as storms and sunsets provide rich color schemes for my ceramics. By throwing porcelain and handbuilding stoneware in an intuitive manner to create surfaces that mimic the eroded bentonitic clay hills or cliffs that form the hallmark features of the Badlands and West/East Coast, I can build up the landscape or seascape structure that is meant to accentuate my atmospheric-like glazes. The spontaneity that I am relying on to keep things interesting in my work is a driving force for my Terraformation Series II. Similar to my Terraformation Series I: Earth Trek Borneo, I consider all of my ceramics to be experimental. I chose to work less predictably because I want to pay homage to the geophysical landscapes and seascapes that hold the key to my curiosity. By experiencing each small landscape/seascape that displays a different kind of clay, I become familiar with the qualities of natural landscape/seascape. I work towards using my ceramic materials and kiln to make ceramic works that resonate back to the character of the original location where that clay was collected from. This explains why all of my recent work has a natural quality to it.

STATEMENT:

The initial impetus for creating my current body of work, 'Rust Never Sleeps', was to come up with a way that I could combine my education in steel fabrication and woodworking, other than using both wood and steel simultaneously. Though the two materials may seem quite different, I found many similarities in the techniques and processes used to make objects, specifically furniture. To name a few, both can require elements of heat to make bends, both can be worked in additive or subtractive ways, and both can be inlaid or pieced together to create decorative

Ultimately, I found that the best way to highlight these similarities in the realm of furniture making was to eliminate wood entirely from my process.

By recreating classic furniture designs completely out of painted and rusted steel, I am able to pay homage to, and in some ways make fun of both craft disciplines and the history of furniture making. At first glance, the pieces appear to be made of wood, and are often met with personal memories and connotations from viewers. Upon closer inspection however, it is revealed that the works are just not quite right, with rust spots, humorous images, or implied textiles, among other effects. I encourage viewers to experience wood and steel in a new light, and reevaluate their relationship to furniture.

STATEMENT:

I love working with wood. Every specie has a different feel and look to its grain. Some grains are rough and dense. Others are smooth and spacious. As a result, each wood is worked differently and each piece presents a challenge. I make my turnings, bowls and cutting boards/serving trays with woods from all over the world, including rosewood, goncalo alves and bubinga from Brazil and zebra wood from Africa. The oak, maple, ash, hickory and walnut I use come from my property. I cut down the trees, cut them on a sawmill and stack them to dry. A combination of light and drk woods, cut in different ways to reveal varying grains, and separated with a thin line of holly or pear wood highlights the beauty of the natural colors of the woods. No stains or dyes are used. My inspiration comes from the ancient art of Egypt, Greece and Native America. When I saw a clay pot at a Native American exhibition, I decided to adapt the design to wood. The shapes of my turnings vary, but each one is a classic form arrived at through extensive research. Each vessel is made from hundreds of solid pieces of native and exotic hardwoods often formed in geometric patterns. Each piece of wood is meticulously measured, precisely cut, carefully glued to others, gently turned on a lathe and finished to a smooth patina. I attempt new ideas in every turning. When successful, I take those concepts and adapt them to other pieces. Once a concept has been proven, I move outside my comfort zone to try new theories and techniques. My one-of-a-kind solid-segmented bowls and cutting boards/serving trays are made with the same level of precision and creativity as my turnings.



In 1976, she moved to the USA where she quickly established a reputation as a designer and tapestry weaver, and regularly taught and exhibited with the Philadelphia Guild of Hand-weavers. In 1980 she returned to Scotland and established a tapestry studio in the Highlands of Scotland. Between 1980 and 1989 she taught weaving skills to over 40 employees and apprentices. She designed award winning miniature tapestry collections and successfully marketed them worldwide. She taught more than 30 short courses and workshops in fiber arts and in managing a craft business. She exhibited throughout Europe and Japan and the USA In 1989 she again emigrated with her family to the USA and returned to weaving tapestries for exhibition and commission only. In early 2001 she opened a new studio in Northern

Chester County PA and began to work also in pastel using that medium to inspire her

tapestries. Nowadays she works from her studio in the Spring City Mill Studios, PA. where she is experimenting with new techniques and subject matter and thoroughly enjoying herself!

STATEMENT:

I am a tapestry weaver and pastel artist. I use the same traditional techniques used in medieval tapestries, but incorporate geometric patterns and textures suggested by the yarns themselves. I also work in pastel, frequently using that medium to inspire my weaving. I am from Scotland, so sea, sky and landscape are favorite subjects. In recent work I have been "painting" using mohair, and brushing it to mimic brush strokes, and to let the viewer "experience" the mist and the skies. This technique allows me to blend very subtle colours and create compelling textures which I encourage the viewer to touch and enjoy.

My paintings explore the representational world with an emphasis on the emotive qualities of common subject matter. Through mark-making, color, and form I seek out and put an emphasis on the local qualities of my subject. I am deeply interested in my surroundings. I particularly find interest in the monotony of everyday life. I'm called to the emotions of indifference, tiredness, contentment, and frustration. It's through these emotions which I attempt to create intrigue through means of my medium itself. My process is one that's rooted in technique. The technique creates the foundation with which I can expand from. While building paint layers, I consistently scrape, shift, and use my palette knife to create moments to move the eye. I draw in a similar manner. My finger acts as the knife and scraper to soften the hard marks and create moments of contrast. It's through these additional techniques that I create moments of distortion which pull the attention in and out of the subject itself. My paintings are constantly reaching to connect with the viewer. I strive for the connection that is felt as you approach a painting. I want my subject to call out. Doing that through subjects which superficially seem indifferent is the challenge. I combat this through the medium itself, letting the paint talk with color, brush strokes, and distortion.

STATEMENT:

I make multilayered, color oriented nonobjective paintings. My process is a joyful meditation. Influences include light on water, sunsets and sunrises, 1960s-70s geometric color system painting, Amish and Gee's Bend Quilts and various indigenous Australian artists. My work explores the parallels of memory and identity, and the feeling of exuberance or lack thereof. It's the fine line of what we remember and imagine. It's the physical experiences, thoughts, or feelings, and how they are connected that become reality. These can be expressions from a memory I've never had, or one that is all too real, and I strive to further discover and understand the physical world from the inside out (or sometimes outside in). When I'm looking to sit and think and explore, that's when my works on canvas or paper come to life; They are moments frozen in permanence, starting as oil paintings or photographs (or both) that become altered with acrylic paint, spray paint, markers, fabric, and whatever feels right. Subject matter shifts from personas to landscapes, abstract to more tangible, often including characters that stare blankly at the viewer, who stare blankly back at the piece. When I hyperfocus I tend to make zines; these are micro obsessions I want to work out and become tangible which makes this media a perfect fit. The subject matter here varies from thematic thoughts to curated chaos and some things in between. Whether the media, I enjoy the process of creating, from picking the weight of the canvas to stapling a zine to gesso and beyond. It's the limitations of mediums that I believe lead to more interesting expression and exploration.

STATEMENT:

My works, essentially, depict human faces and figures, although the subjects become paintings, not portraits. Snapshots of people I meet casually can be a takeoff for inspiration. I stay in touch with reality with frequent figure drawing sessions. My compositions begin with a sound drawing in pencil. Drawing is an important part of my process and the underpinning lines are often left visible and even enhanced. I then cut loose and work intuitively with large brushes, flats and rounds, to keep the image fresh and understated. Layers of thin watercolor washes build a sense of atmosphere and mystery. The uneven edges and unpainted areas hold a relationship with the paper, fading in and out, allowing the composition to grow and breathe.

Sometimes, the background contains elements suggesting a narrative for the viewer to interpret, although I hold nothing specific in mind.

STATEMENT:

"Triplets in White" is the third painting in my Triplets Series. The three sisters, who are genetically identical, are each beautifully independent. They stand before a dark, ancient outcropping of rocks that resemble a secret theater, or maybe an alter or a cathedral. It is a place where they each find "that feeling", one that can only be experienced in such a place. The musty but sweet smell of wet leaves and lichen on the damp rocks fills the air. When I scouted the location for this painting's photoshoot, I was looking for such a place. I found it just down the road from my farm on a neighbor's property. After getting permission from the owner, I borrowed a good friend's wedding dress and the model, who I repeat in the composition to portray triplets, wore this as well as a white cape I had gotten to complete the ensemble. I've felt compelled to paint or draw from early on. When a strong vision comes to mind I do rough sketches, often posing in front of a mirror. Next I choose a model, gather clothing for the photoshoot, and scout locations either on horseback, on foot on my farm, or I drive around the area in the car. Then when the model arrives and is dressed and in the chosen location, I do all of the reference photography myself. After pouring over the many photos, I make a composite of the final composition using multiple photographs and create a finished drawing that I transfer the major reference points of on to the canvas or panel with graphite.

I feel my work is unique from many because I choose to render the model and her surroundings with the same level of detail. That is not to say everything is in sharp focus. It is very important in my opinion to play with depth of field much as a camera does, only I can choose to do this organically rather than mechanically like a lens. I pay close attention to edges with some being totally lost in value and softness and others sharper.



STATEMENT:

My inspirations range widely and include a French Gothic Altarpiece of the Passions of Christ located in the Walters Art Museum, Baltimore, MD; Picasso's "Still Life with Chair Caning"; various works by Archipenko and Kurt Schwitters; and numerous photographers including August Sander, Ray Metzker, Andre Kertesz, Cartier-Bresson, Atget, etc.. What follow are a series of observations and statements that pertain to my work:

I remember first seeing the work of the Flemish painters. Who, among all the painters in history, were more enamored of the visible world? I felt admiration for their sheer delectation in describing how things look. A whiff of smoke from an extinguished candle or the texture of fur; for them everything was worth seeing and rendering.

Most of us are beset by doubts at various times but it is the artist's lot that he or she must accept, indeed embrace not knowing in order to achieve some breakthrough.

I cannot imagine making photographs solely for the purpose of putting them away in boxes, taking them out from time to time for a few moments of furtive reverie only to return them to the shelf. Everyone I've known who makes pictures desires an audience if for no other reason than the notion that viewers inevitably carry with them the possibility of completing the equation, of supplying insights and comprehension the artist is incapable of reaching on his/her own. What compels me to return to intriguing works of art again and again is how little on close examination the great ones recreate the external world. Why else would we find them alluring, compelling, or mysterious? Why else would we look at them more than once?

Many of my images are an object lesson in paying attention, simply looking, not in making a point. Appearances, as the saying goes, can be misleading. Photography is thought to unravel mysteries but at its best often succeeds in deepening them.

The consolation of art is survival. I dread being forgotten.

I photograph history. I strive to tell stories through my photography and no place is more richly woven in tragic storylines than the American penitentiary. These images are part of my broader portfolio on abandoned prisons, and they specifically focus on SCI Cresson.

Originally built as a Tuberculosis Sanitorium in 1913, the institution went through various transformations before becoming a medium security correctional facility known as State Correctional Institute (SCI) Cresson in 1987. Unfortunately, it was notorious for its use of solitary confinement and poor treatment of mentally ill inmates, which led to its eventual closure in 2013. In 2005, the Secure Special Needs Unit (SSNU) was introduced to treat prisoners with mental illness. It was the first program of its kind in the state and involved a five-phase program, starting with 23-hour solitary isolation and leading up to private property access, inmate interactions and group therapy sessions.

Sadly, the program was poorly executed, with inmates in the SSNU languishing in solitary confinement indefinitely without a treatment plan or hope of ever progressing. The chief psychologist tasked with overseeing the program, Dr. James Harrington, implemented was a program of isolation and abuse intended to break prisoners and obtain their compliance. The process could take up to two years, and the results were devastating: seven suicides in eighteen months. As a consequence, the Department of Justice (DOJ) conducted a civil rights probe into SCI Cresson under the 1980 Civil Rights of Institutionalized Persons Act.





Ever since I was a child, I have been experimenting with a gamut of mediums and art practices. It began with pencil drawings which led to mixed media sculptures. STATEMENT:

My name is Diana Laura. I am a growing artist based in Lancaster, Pennsylvania. My main focus is sculpture, I handmake pieces made of copper, wood and stone.

My interest in sculpture began at DCAD where I was introduced to abstract work through stone carving. While struggling to find myself within drawing and painting I realized that my imagination was more well-suited to the 3D form. As I continued to develop a passion for sculpture, I was then taught different ways to use wood and metal. These new materials led me to experiment with composition through abstract forms. From this I developed a strong interest in movement, gravity and elegance. I try to express these elements through all of my pieces. In the past three years my work has revolved around the use of copper. Since then my work changed from having a symbolic meaning to focusing on materials and process-oriented techniques. All of my copper work is hand cut with a jewelry saw and hand sanded. Most recently I've been experimenting with different metal finishes, the first display of this is through my sculpture Positions. This piece is also my first large scale copper sculpture. Although I've been able to produce intricate work in a short period of time, hand-cutting copper has its size restraints. Due to this, I've been challenging my skills in composition and structure to create detailed, intricate and elaborate large scale copper sculptures.

Starting with a leaf, flower, or 'weed' in my garden studied and tended over many years, seeing them in every light and season. Jacob C. Hammes is an interdisciplinary artist, arts organizer, and educator based in Philadelphia. Working primarily in sculpture, drawing, and sound, Hammes' work explores themes of late capitalist anxieties and absurdities, examining how we constitute ourselves as individuals within these networks of culture, labor, and authority. Hammes holds a BFA from the School of the Art Institute of Chicago and an MFA from Tyler School of Art. He teaches at Tyler School of Art, Moore College of Art and Design, and University of the Arts.

Hammes is currently working on a large-scale public art project in collaboration with Mural Arts Philadelphia on the site of Prevention Point, which is a harm-reduction and aid organization that serves communities of unhoused and addiction-facing residents in Philadelphia's Kensington neighborhood. The project involves repair, mural painting, and the fabrication of useful infrastructure, including a solar-powered kitchen built inside a modified shipping container.

Hammes is the author and illustrator of "101 Jokes About the Working Class," a collection of (mostly) Leftist jokes and illustrations, and "The Grand Ballroom of Doom," a biweekly comic strip published by the Philly Art Blog that depicts the brutality of late-stage capitalism as absurdist comedy. He has served as the Director and Curator of Pilot+Projects, an artist-run exhibition space in Philadelphia, since 2016. Hammes has shown his work at spaces such as the Philadelphia Museum of Art, the National Liberty Museum, the Woodmere Art Museum, The Grunwald Gallery at Indiana University, The Hills Aesthetic Center, Temple Contemporary, Moore College of Art and Design, The Hyde Park Art Center, the Te Tuhi Centre for the Arts in Auckland, Information Space, and the Museum of Contemporary Art Chicago.

STATEMENT:

I refuse to make work that presents either an easy answer or an easy question, choosing instead to invite engagement with the precarious via objects and environments that call for effort, slowness, care, and genuine engagement. Using process as a substitute for self, I explore facets of trauma, question normative behavior, and examine vulnerability through the interplay of materials distilled to their simplest, most poetic essence. STATEMENT:

Under the Microscope is an immersive self-standing custom-built light booth of over 3500 printed microscope glass slides lined side by side, covering the enclosed 3-panel space - similar in size to a phone booth. The content is of graphics and text of writings and drawings from my journals written and maintained over many years of living with and caring for a family member with co-occurring disorders of mental health and substance use disorder. It is a written and drawn compilation of my stories and experiences of watching someone I love deeply digress into the broken systems of mental health, substance abuse, and incarceration. I wanted others to experience what goes on inside my head on a daily basis while watching and trying to help navigate. The intimate space of the booth is pertinent for the viewer to receive the full effect and urgency of the messages. By documenting, journaling, researching, drawing, and recording incidents from my own life, I can immerse the viewer in the chaos and trauma, showing how mental health affects the whole family. The microscope as a symbol relates to deep examination, curiosity, and discovery. The use of glass microscope slides reflects the idea of being under careful examination, a microscopic eye revealing intimate details too small to be seen by the unaided eye. The slides are also a metaphor for biology. Although the exact cause of most mental illnesses is not known, it is becoming clear through research that many of these conditions are caused by a combination of biological, psychological, and environmental factors. The booth also references Rose Marie Kennedy and her life leading up to the lobotomy, Geraldo Rivera, who exposed the abuse and neglect at Willowbrook State School, and the NYCLU's fight for civil liberties. This project relies on the concern and efforts of others to make change happen and to help change or lessen the stigma surrounding people with mental health disorders as well as the family and friends who support them. An open dialogue that searches for truth and transparency in a society that believes in tough love, punishment, and confinement.

Dowry Jars: The Dowry Jars and the historic Pennsylvania Dowry Chests of the 18th and 19th centuries both represent examples of material culture that serve to preserve and protect valuable items for future generations. The jars are just as ornately decorated as their historic counterparts, but reference stages of germination, the gold acting as a highlight to the wonder that it is our natural world. The jars could act as containers foodstuffs or seeds, which across many cultures are the most valuable item to preserve for the survival and prosperity of future generations. The round shape of these vessels also serves as a reminder of the need to protect and invest in our future in more sustainable ways; Earth is the most precious resource we have. Perhaps the most important thing these vessels contain is the hope for our global future. Love Glasses: Our perception is shaped by various factors such as past experiences, cultural background, and context. The lenses through which we see the world can also impact our perception, whether they are physical or metaphorical. An example of combining these concepts is seen in Mughal Empire's emerald and diamond spectacles, which were believed to have astrological and healing powers. The idea of using gems to soothe the eyes can be traced back to ancient times. As a child, my go-to accessory was a pair of heart-shaped rainbow sparkle sunglasses. While my family all wore corrective lenses, I was the exception until a few years ago. I wore my "Love Glasses" every day, everywhere. They provided a sense of comfort and confidence to my younger self, surely an early expression of my personal identity and individuality. Inspired by the Mughal spectacles, I recreated my childhood "Love Glasses" using clear quartz as lenses and various gemstones with symbolic values. The glasses are intended to encourage self-reflection, observation, and interpretation, providing a new lens through which to view oneself and the world.

These standards are self-imposed in response to societal expectations and our own innate need to conform. We are not the only ones policing our conformity we are judged by others, as well. Not just the people we see in passing, but our mothers, sisters, and friends. Our true form may or may not be consistent with the contemporary idealized image of a beautiful, successful woman. Clothing such as high heels and corsets reform the body into an unnatural shape, which may paradoxically be considered the ideal. While continuously exploring the human figure I have found that the evolution of my artistic concept is parallel to gender stresses and insecurities and are juxtaposed with issues surrounding female politics. I create art that navigates and addresses longing standing gender constraints and perception. These stereotypes halt us from the past and are usually unspoken. My work creates a forum for this conversation and helps us see if not feel how that transition continues to affect us in the here and now. I have experimented with a myriad of materials in an attempt to bring forth these notions in my art. The recurring theme of transparent materials, in contrast to opaque, is indicative of the ephemeral quality of the human body. This is evident in my current work representing the dichotomy between the delicate yet powerful self, and the evolving roles women play set forth by societal structure.

I make my work visually distinct by manipulating the female form into a beautiful yet mysterious piece of art. I do this by elongating, concealing, or extracting elements from the figure and transforming them into a rigid structure such as bronze or resin. This I feel enables the viewer to embrace the art for its beauty whether or not they embrace or understand my concept.



STATEMENT:

Sometimes the pieces I create tell a story, more often they exist inside the context of one. I make objects that belong somewhere else, and have a story of their own. I find the idea of a post-paradigm shift future, and what it may hold, perpetually fascinating; both terrifying and hopeful at turns. This interest stems from a rejection of my own mortality: to me, the most tragic and upsetting thing about one's own death is not getting to find out what happens: the story goes on, but you will miss all future installments. Through my work, I imagine some of the infinite stories I will miss out on. GeoGyro is a part of a larger installation entitled "The WasteLand", which locates the viewer inside a museum of the ancient-future. There are vines & machines, and they are connected by an internal narrative that dictates much of the work's content. SeedCircuit [1] explores the reproduction of lost things through digital means. All of the woods shown are their natural color; there are no dyes or stains etc. With this piece, I imagine a future full of people surrounded by technology far surpassing anything we have today, but nonetheless longing for the past. The bits of wood contained within the cubes are the last remaining samples of a lost age. The SeedCircuit is chipping away at the genetic sequence of the samples, attempting to discover, and perhaps recreate, whatever unknown organisms they came from. AstroObject [2b.x0] is a machine of unknown purpose that recalls the polished brass and warm wood aesthetics of antique celestial navigation tools or laboratory equipment. It is a fantastical object aimed at sparking the viewer's imagination, but is also an exploration of the interplay between fine art and craft.

In these three images, she was in full goofy character, putting on a show for me and the photographer (our server). Printing these three photos onto Japanese paper stock, cut them into strips and wove creating a pixilated triptych. I realized after finishing this series that what I had created was a moving homage to her, one which reminded me of the Japanese philosophy of "ichi-go, ichi-e" (one time, one meeting). For me, this rang so true...at the time these photos were taken, neither one of us would have known how precious this photo shoot would be especially as she would pass just a few years later. I will hold dearly this memory of our time together, eating her favorite comfort food

at her favorite Japanese restaurant, having a good time and enjoying each other's company without a care or worry of the past or future, just of this very moment.

STATEMENT:


As a survivor of war and a war refugee, my art work searches for the proper artistic response to pain, suffering, and trauma. Through print media, I embrace the complex relationship between lived experience and representation, between remembering and forgetting, and between migrating and staying.

In "Pedestrian Entry", I juxtaposes a photo of the US/Mexico border wall with a silkscreen composite of my petition for asylum. For the first time in 35 years, in the summer of 2021 I saw a copy of my asylum papers and I got stand by the border that my family crossed undocumented as war refugees. According to my Request for Asylum in the United States form, my arrival to the US occurred on June 4, 1987, at the port of Tijuana, I was not inspected, and I was classified as an "Other (Specify) War Refugee" whose means of arrival was "Pedestrian Entry."

"Insurrection II" presents a composite print of news photographs from the chaos of the January 6th insurrection.

"NYTimes BLM" composites all the covers of the New York Times from the month of June, 2020, in the midst of the Black Lives Matter protests.

"In-dependence" is a print installation that explores Latin American identity and United States hegemony through intervened flags. The flag of each country in Latin America is imprinted with a black version of the United States flag, creating a visual symbol of the duality of Latinx identity as well as US intervention across the hemisphere.

STATEMENT:

I make artworks based on my life experience, focusing on location, definition and cognition of the impacts of trauma and place. Over the last five years, I have been re-working a project titled "Addresses," which includes schematic pencil drawings of all the places I have lived and a 93 item legend made from icons found in common clip art designs that related to events, things and people that happened, where or lived in these locations. More recently I began working on a series of ink and gouache drawings title "The Breach" that represents through local patterns and abstracted perspectival drawings, places where I experienced trauma.

My art making includes works on paper, text-based images and installations. For instance, my project "The Breach" is made from drawings based on my memories of spaces in which I was traumatized. These works begin with the development of a pattern based on something I remember being in that particular space, like wall paper or someone's clothing. After developing these local patterns, I will draw from memory ten perspectival drawings of each space. After rendering these points of view, I select five, and create a background pattern that mashes up these perspectives. The results are Escherlike in their lack of exits or realism. I then overlay this background image with the local patterns I have created.

My works, especially "The Breach," are a means to incorporate the violence to my person, promises broken, and the potential wasted in these incidents and heal. For my audience, I hope these works evoke wonder and beauty while also starting a discussion about how confronting ugly events can lead to transformation. When I started this series I wanted to capture the sense of chaos that trauma induces; to show the perspective of the world going sideways and to face what happened and how those events have shaped me. In the end they are more than that.

STATEMENT:

Placemaking and Aging in the Space of Suburbia: Absence, presence, and Hercules' New Labors

The smell of spring mulch heavily applied to regulate flower beds in their carefully curated rectangles and semi-circles, summer sounds of mowers and edge-trimmers that ensure manicured lawns, and the splashing and screeching emerging from backyard pools, define most of the American suburban living. In her book, Lure of the Local: Sense of Place in a Multi-centered Society, Lucy Lippard speaks of places as hybrids of knowledges and experiences that are both visible and invisible to the exterior: "By entering that hybrid, we change it; and in each situation, we may play a different role." How does one recognize the impact they have upon entering an existing space while also acknowledging one's self-transformation through the process? What does placemaking mean as one navigates the relationship between the interior - the invisible – and the exterior – the visible? I examine this relationship through interior/exterior investigations of space and place with suggestions of the absence/ presence of family life in these spaces through the objects occupying them. Simultaneously, I am working on a series inspired by the 12 labors of Hercules in an attempt to interrogate the disciplined tasks of the suburban homeowner as a cultural staple of the American middle-class. Specifically, I foreground my own experience moving to the suburbs in Fall of 2019 as a middle-aged white man, and I portray myself as an aging Hercules engaged in daily chores. While my drawings are meant to ridicule the implied heroism of the mundane, yet sustained activities, they also interrogate my own role in maintaining suburbia's protocols as I critically reflect on the invisible stories that reveal economic and social strains on the middle class in America.

STATEMENT:

I work with landscapes because I feel that there is a potential for expressiveness inherent in the depiction of organic forms. I am also drawn to them because they are both universal and personal; they are intertwined in both individual lives and collective histories, and are historically and culturally relevant in the art community and in the larger world. Though they are constantly changing, they are ever-present.

Because landscapes are so involved in human life, they lend themselves well to the discussion of personal experience. My primary philosophical influence is phenomenology, a branch of philosophy that deals with the subjectivity of experience, as our knowledge of the world comes primarily through our senses. Because sensory input is the primary means through which we can interact with the world, as we are beings in physical forms, we rely on these senses for how we interpret our experiences.

My work is an examination of the strong connection that exists between human consciousness and its surrounding environment, specifically the way in which our sensory experience of a place influences our subjective interpretation of it. I present the viewer with scenes of heightened atmosphere that are indicative of a sense of reflection and quiet attention to the elements of the world that are both physical and nonphysical, as the external world reflects the internal life of the viewer.

STATEMENT:

Scientific theories and phenomena, collecting, and exploring the outdoors have always been a sustaining force of influence in my art practice. The experience of nature where I have lived and where I have visited has allowed the creation of a visual representation of that outside world that excites me. It is a merge of experimentation, examination, scientific and private collecting. The repetition and collective build up of shapes and forms in nature is the inspiration for my artwork. I seek to expose the structures of the outside world revealing the layers from the ground to the sky or the buildup of microscopic organisms to make up the macroscopic world. Looking closely you can see the pattern and structure of the organisms that work together to make something new. I have found a correlation between the two sources that mimic one another. I am very intrigued by the way microscopic and macroscopic forms can visually appear alike and repeat themselves. I enjoy the idea of an organism being made of smaller structures that look like the larger design they create. The imagery that I use is either circles that mimic microscopic slides or petri dishes, or long landscapes that show the ground to the sky and everything in-between. I emulate and represent the organic and imaginative beauty and structure of the natural environment by using direct and personal representations of macroscopic and microscopic images. I am interested in the combination of these images to show a space between what is known and what is uncovered and by shifting scale and perspective, the big becomes the small, the massive becomes the minuscule and the expected becomes the unexpected.
