My work has been included in over a hundred National and International Shows. It has been mentioned in hundreds of newspaper and Magazine articles and over forty books. I have been the recipient of a Mid Atlantic Arts Grant and I was awarded the Excellence in Education Award by the Davinci Science Center. I have been the Wood Arts Instructor at the Ninth oldest School in the United States for the last 14 years where we have five lathes. I have taught reading in the prison system of PA and taught Woodturning at the old YMCA at 53rd and Lexington Ave in NYC. STATEMENT:

RESUME:

As an artist, printmaker and storyteller, Patty Kennedy-Zafred creates thought provoking narratives using fabric, dyes, silkscreens, and ink to develop a visual dialogue with the viewer. The interpretation of each piece is conceived through the lens of individual experiences, memories, or perspectives. Her quilts marry a lifelong fascination with photography, history, and stitch, often reflecting faces of pride and dignity, sometimes under challenging circumstances. Kennedy-Zafred has been telling stories through the medium of textiles and art quilts for over thirty years. Her prize winning work has been exhibited nationally and internationally, and has been published in books and magazines throughout her career, most recently *Artistry in Fiber*, *Art Quilts Unfolding*, and *American Cotton: Farm to Quilt*. She was selected as a Master Visual Artist VII, Preserving the Legacy, in Pittsburgh, and the work was acquired by the Heinz History Center. Kennedy-Zafred's work has been accepted into major internationally recognized exhibitions, including *CraftForms*, *Quilt National*, *Art of the State*, *Visions*, *Fiberart International*, *Artist as Quiltmaker*, *Fantastic Fibers*, *Quilts=Art=Quilts*, *Fiber Options*, *Art Quilt Elements*, *New Legacies*, *National Fiber Directions*, and numerous invitational exhibitions. Her work has traveled across the United States, the United Kingdom, Europe, China, Japan, and Australia, and has won top prizes at American Quilt Society competitions and International Quilt Festival, including a Masters in Innovation Award in 2018. Her art is part of the permanent collections of the State Museum of Pennsylvania, The International Quilt and Textile Museum, Lincoln, NE, San Jose Museum of Quilts and Textiles, The Textile Museum, Washington, DC, and The Clinton Presidential Library & Museum, as well as private collections.

STATEMENT:

Utilizing textiles, dyes, photo emulsion silkscreens, hand dyed fabric and unexpected substrates, such as vintage feed sacks, my work is an effort to create a visual dialogue with the viewer. The interpretation of each piece is conceived through the lens of individual experiences, memories, or perspectives. This work marries my lifelong fascination with photography, history and stitch, and often presents faces of pride and dignity, sometimes under challenging circumstances. The works submitted are part of my Native American Series and American Portraits Series, yet reflect upon universal experiences, historical time periods, human frailties and injustice. In 1830, amid controversy and opposition, President Andrew Jackson signed the Indian Removal Act, forcibly removing thousands of Native Americans to reservations west of the Mississippi River. Jackson's goal was to "separate the Indians from immediate contact with settlements of whites," claiming, "the policy of the Government toward the red man is not only liberal, but generous." *Spirits Rising* and *Many Hearts Afire* reflect on the struggles of Native Americans, which transcends time, and can be connected to the continual hardship, injustice and discrimination experienced by indigenous people today. The agricultural landscape of America has changed dramatically since 1900, when half of the population lived and worked on farms. Every week, faced with economic hardship, long hours, and corporate competition, hundreds of family farmers leave their land for good. The independent family farm is an essential part of our diverse American fabric, representing strength, tenacity, patience, and perseverance. Inspired by 1930's U.S. Farm Security Administration photographs, *Deep Roots* is my tribute to the diverse faces of American farm life, both past and present, who struggle to survive, often experiencing great sacrifice.

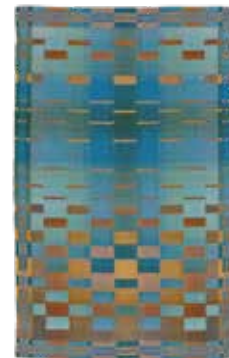

Color is what delights and inspires me. Color is what I see first and foremost as I move through the world. My weavings most often begin with a color palette based on place; the design follows to express change, movement, transition, and depth. The Lake series was inspired by the palette of the glacial lakes of the Canadian Rockies.

Doubleweave—cloth with two distinct layers of fabric—is the weave structure I use to create my images. It's fascinated me since I learned to weave because it suits my imagination, allowing precise and subtle variations of perspective and color within the orderly framework of the loom. I'm excited to see the colors of yarn when they come out of the dye pot and to see an image develop once the yarn is on the loom.

STATEMENT:

I throw my forms on a wheel and start burnishing them during the trimming process.

The burnishing continues until the clay is bone dry. After bisque firing the pieces, I

fire the blue glaze for the interior and then the gold firing on the exterior.

The final phase, laying the horsehair on the ware, is the primal creative experience for me. It is a very fast and fluid process. The kiln is raised to 1800 degrees Fahrenheit. Watching for heat radiant cues on the ware I pick the exact moment to stop the firing and immediately reduced with Horsehair.

The carbon from the hair embeds into the burnished layers of clay resulting in translucent planes of line and smoke.

The temperature of the piece is critical to how the hair will reduce for certain affects. White lines are made when the carbon oxidizes at its hottest point. Thicker hair gives different results than the thinner hair. Dark bold lines are created with thick hair when the piece is at its hottest. Finer hairs are laid down last as the piece cools down. They leave patterning and thinner lines.

The piece is cleaned of horsehair ash revealing its carbon print in the clay. A light buff with wax helps seal the bare clay body. The shine is buffed out with a soft cloth.

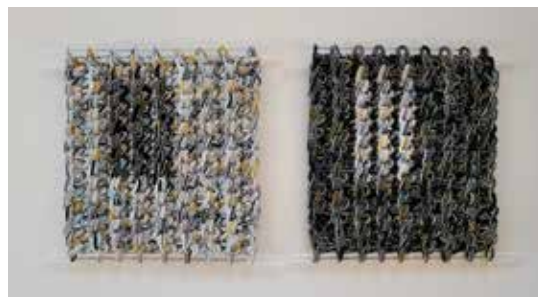

This piece titled "The Amy Piece" was influenced by the sketches drawn by my wife Amy that were found by the telephone. I drew inspiration from the simple patterns in relation to the spatial arrangements. The ambition of this jewelry piece was to capture a similar geometric feel with a layered aesthetic. Then to establish a detailed interior that uses balance, contrast and shapes that flow together. The Amy Piece Necklace was constructed with titanium, 18k gold, 18k gold bi-metal. The process began with a graphic drawing incorporating the engineering and aesthetic concerns. The parts were then hand cut from metal sheet, tubing and wire specifically following the demands of the intended design. The components of each piece were refined and textured. The parts were then arranged in multiple layers and separated by cut pieces of tubing (spacers). Cold connecting with rivets completes the design.

STATEMENT:

Making art, for me, is an organic process that is not easily defined. Beginning intuitively the first "line" on the surface becomes the fifth, because it relates to the other four sides of the canvas or paper. After that early stage of positioning a mark, color, form, etc... a relationship is established, and the work tells me what it wants.

My approach is trial and error.

Through the act of painting or drawing (my two primary practices) worlds open-up, collide, collapse, and conclusions are agreed upon that contribute to the piece's undersurface. I'm engaged in creating art that utilizes both a breadth and depth of image-making techniques.

By both transforming the figure ground surface, as well as eliminating extraneous stuff, highlighting what captures and tantalizes, the work becomes weighted with layers of history. From the initial touch, modalities of: memories, blissfulness, habits, comedy, tendencies, or grudging directions, even aversions are forged during the painting process, –and I go with it, watching it unfold. At that point the work and I are in a closer conversation with washes of color hiding, masking the past in a murky atmosphere of grays, dark browns and blacks, or white along with a limited color palette to call forth an image. I think of this body of work as my "Ghost" paintings.

STATEMENT:

Compositions arise from something in my visual experience that evokes an emotional response. Then analysis begins. I do drawings to understand the meaning of the image and to explore the forms, lines and colors that convey that meaning. Extraneous elements are edited out. A final composition drawing is done, carefully plotting out the linear or curvilinear perspective. This is cropped to produce the patterns of shapes that emphasize the meaning the image holds for me. Finally, with the content and the proportions established for the painting, the dimensions are determined. Generally, I favor smaller works for their intimacy and vulnerability. However, there are some images that need to envelop rather than draw in a viewer, and for those a larger format is selected. I prefer not to discuss the meaning of a painting, except to say that the piece does have content and to encourage viewers to explore it for themselves. A painting's meaning is something that should be established between the piece and the individual viewer. Once the painting is done, it no longer needs me.

STATEMENT:

I often find my subjects in galleries at exhibit openings. I watched these tall and smartly dressed "chums" walk past me, and then went chasing after them to get permission for a snapshot. They seemed amused and fell into a natural pose, comfortable with each other. I tried to depict that connection.

Sometimes I suggest a narrative for the viewer to complete. Visually balanced yet complex, the "outside" figure is reflected in inner ambiguity. She stands apart from passersby, holding her thoughts secret.

My compositions begin with a sound drawing in pencil. Drawing is an important part of my process and the underpinning lines are often left visible and even enhanced. Light glazes build atmosphere and mystery.

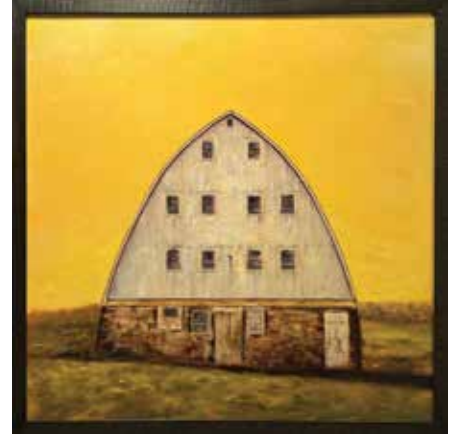

STATEMENT:

Art and music have been connected in my mind ever since I unwrapped the Beatles' *Sgt. Pepper's Lonely Hearts Club Band* album at the age of eight. Music is a big part of my studio practice and the titles of my paintings and collages are often derived from the music that is playing while I work.

When I exhibit my paintings and collages, I often include QR codes to the songs that I was listening to in my studio while I worked late at night. The music is part of the work, or at least influences its making.

I never know how to respond to people's questions about my work. What are these paintings 'about'? Best I can come up with is this: if you are listening to jazz or classical music, you don't ask what it is about - you feel the rhythms, melodies, textures, and patterns. Same for these mostly abstract paintings and collages.

As the music plays in my studio, the paintings and collages become sites of construction and excavation. I experiment by first laying down foundations, then surveying the sites for key color relationships and dominant organizations. Ultimately, I assemble new elements onto the field like a cropped image of a building, angles of gabled roofs, empty lots, and small views of large cities. An infinite vocabulary of shapes is obscured by hazy, patterned gestures complicating the systems, hovering above landscapes or expanding logarithmically away from Earth.

STATEMENT:

Thoughts on the Body of Work Exhibited by R. Andrew Hoff

The exhibition is part of a project that I have been involved with since 2017. I have been working this portfolio of images for four years (COVID wiped out the fair/carnival circuit in 2019 & 2020). The images I have selected are made as a representation of the irony of the fair/carnival circuit. There are three types of personalities that I focus on. There are the happy people, there are those that are irritated by my presence documenting their life by photographing them and there are those that look like they want to be anywhere but there. One type of image is the look of loneliness, boredom and indifference displayed by those that work the fair/carnival circuit as well as those that are attending the festivities. Conversely I am also drawn to people with big personalities and of course there are the people that don't want to be photographed. This dichotomy of personalities is part of the exhibition. I am also striving to capture facial expressions and body language, in particular the eyes of people and their body language. They say the eyes are a window to the soul. Notice how I present the eyes. Do these eyes emit passion or anger? Are these eyes vapid? The slouch of the shoulders to the awkward position of their limbs is of particular importance to these photographs. Do these people look uncomfortable, perhaps bored wishing for a different outcome in their life? These two key elements are instrumental in the quality of the complete image. The dichotomy of life at these fairs and carnivals is what I am aiming to present.

RESUME:

I obtained my first single lens reflex camera at the age of 16, took a couple of photography classes as a college undergraduate, and worked as a Student Photography Assistant in the media center at the Indiana University of Pennsylvania. I did not get really serious about photography until 1988 when I enrolled in classes at the Harrisburg Area Community College under the direction of Professor Ron Talbott. After completing all the photography classes, I pursued enrollment in a graduate program but needed to work around a full-time job and a family. I was fortunate to be accepted by Professor John Weiss into the Master of Fine Arts program at the University of Delaware. I graduated with an M.F.A. degree in photography in 1998. I began as a part-time adjunct photography instructor in 1996 at the Harrisburg Area Community College where I taught classes in beginning and advanced black and white film photography. I retired from my full-time Commonwealth of Pennsylvania position and from the Harrisburg Area Community College teaching position in June 2011.

I was part of a two-person show at the Doshi Gallery in Harrisburg, and two five-person shows at the Art Association of Harrisburg. I have been a finalist in the Pennsylvania Art of the State competition on a number of occasions and have had work in many other local exhibits. Articles that I have had published include: "Myths and Misconceptions" and "Critiquing—One Step at a Time" which both appeared in the Ilford Photo Instructor. My M.F.A. thesis was titled "The Role of the Unconscious in the Creative Act" and my M.F.A. show was called "Resonances and Repercussions" (a theme inspired by the book *The Poetics of Space* by Gaston Bachelard). A self-made photography book titled "Subconscious Perceptions" is in the library at the Harrisburg Area Community College under the special collections section. I had a solo show at the Rose Lehrman Art Gallery of the Harrisburg Area Community College.

STATEMENT:

"When I photograph, it is a strong belief of mine that my unconscious is a powerful tool, which has a great influence on the final image. This intuitive process of creating images for me is photographic reverie.

I hope that my images are visually and emotionally stimulating and will resonate in such a way that they create a personal dialogue with the viewer."

I have been using the above artist statement for many years. It is concise, pared-down and still valid but I have decided to expand its scope and add some specifics as to my relationship with photography.

Creating a photograph that I like is difficult and it does not matter whether I am using film or digital. Usually, any of my preconceived visual ideas don't work and successful images mostly happen when I open my eyes and mind to the surroundings. Serendipity seems to play a major role. I react to the environment and, when using a model, how the model interacts with it. I like discovering objects, textures or other unusual elements at a location which I can incorporate into the final image.

If one viewer emotionally connects to a photograph, then I see that as a success. I do not create work to please the masses.

I like photographs that have a psychological edge with emotional impact. I want the viewer to feel something when looking at my work. Good or bad, like it or hate it, positive or negative feelings, praise it or mock it, disturbing or enlightening, think it a treasure or throw it in the trash bin, find it pornographic or socially acceptable—just don't be passive toward my photographs. No ho-hums allowed.

I believe my most creative moment is when I push the shutter. Eye and mind must work together while looking through the viewfinder.

I make my work without a social or political agenda. There is no message or hidden purpose. The photograph is the photograph. What the viewer sees and interprets is out of my control.

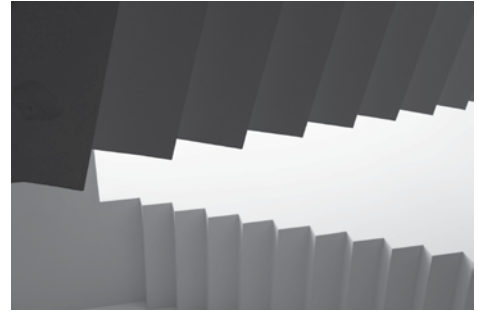

STATEMENT:

I am a contemporary, queer photo-based artist with a strong focus on pushing the boundaries of photography. My artistic exploration revolves around queer theory, particularly how photography holds the power to present a seemingly straightforward world while sidelining perspectives outside the frame. In essence, I see photography as a metaphor for heteronormativity and work to destabilize it through conceptual or visual modes of infiltration.

In my latest endeavors, I have expanded my practice into 2D installations of photographs to craft a captivating and immersive gallery experience. Employing a special, non-damaging printing paper that sticks to the walls, I aim to radically transform photography and gallery spaces into an all-encompassing queer sanctuary. Much of this work is adaptive, contains multiple images, extends from floor to ceiling, and/or utilizes full walls to provide impactful visual statements.

One of my current bodies of work, *I Thought You Were a Doorway*, is tied to home and domesticity as it references the complications and distance that borders can create. These borders also reflect the complications of queerness as expressed in my artist statement below:

Borders create a collection of guidelines in which my actions, words, and desires construct my queer identity. They contain me. But queerness can never truly be contained by a set of borders because that would imply a limitation of possibilities. So, I cross a line again and again and again to create a queer neutrality in which I am suspended and everything destabilizes. But the lines remain even as I try to dissolve old containers.

This work considers the way queerness creates its own borders as much as it tries to dismantle them. It combines the personal, visual, and theoretical ways in which borders construct our identities but also disconnects us from an array of queer potentiality.

I have no formal training in the field but took a few local courses and seminars so that I could get a general understanding of using my camera. STATEMENT:

'Composite #7' is a history of my photographic career. This picture consists of the main subject from approximately five-hundred separate photographs taken by me over many years and composited into this one photograph. The process was to extract the main subject from its original photograph and shrink it to fit into the overall composite. The five dancing figures in the center were created by me as the last step to celebrate my happiness that I had finally completed the picture after spending six months on this project. My inspiration for starting this project was a newspaper article describing how a digital artist had created a NFT composite which sold at Christie's for 69.3 million.

The piece titled "Old People" was inspired by the active lives of the many seniors in the independent living residence where I reside. Everybody here is a senior including me. I've become friendly with a number of the residents here and thought it would be an interesting project to do an individual portrait of each of my friends (which total 80 separate portraits) and then combine them in one composite picture. Partway through the project it occurred to me to also make a caricature of each of the subjects whose portrait I took and also integrate them into the final picture. When I added my self-portrait and caricature the final number in this composite became one hundred and sixty-two. Needless to say, this piece also took me six months to complete.

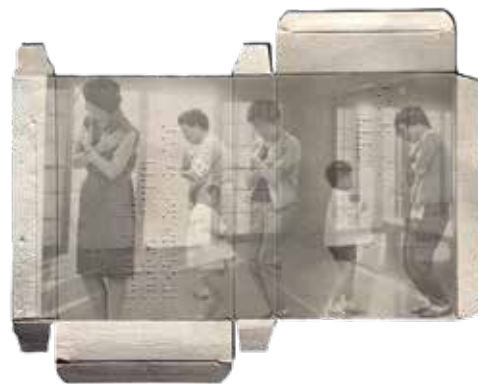

STATEMENT:

My photographic collages serve as a metaphor for anticipation, those moments when the unknown is being revealed.

The implied act of opening the boxes, releases the occupants, allowing them to take flight. The people and objects confined within, through the simple act of unfolding, are exposed revealing what was previously hidden.

I try to convey excitement, and energy in images that are playful, expressive, and nostalgically bring the viewer back to the joyful moments of anticipation felt in childhood.

The sense of nostalgia evoked in the graphic synthesis of these images is augmented using a wash of warm sepia tones that permeate the images. There is also a visual correlation between inhabitants of the boxes and the boxes themselves. The folds of the boxes having a quality not unlike origami, is reflected in the contortionist-like bending of the human forms within.

The unusual and dissimilar combination of people and cardboard boxes is visually unified through the repetition of angles. Despite pairing such disparate elements, I bring them together harmoniously to form images with visual impact, and are frankly, fun to look at.

STATEMENT:

When we cut shapes from cloth or paper, then take them away, what remains is a kind of stencil-like skein left by the pattern of missing pieces, in itself seemingly useless, a thing worthy only of being discarded. I tend to think of these leftovers as a kind of mental analogy for a range of common objects found everywhere around us: the metal step treads of a fire escape descending into the darkness, shapes and textures found in an outdoor sculpture, intricate curving lines distorted in the reflection of massive architectural structure. Despite their sometimes-surprising beauty, because of their commonness and banality, we never look at them directly; they are most often classed as unworthy of our attention.

Over the past several years, I've become fascinated by "the inconspicuous" and what those kinds of objects reveal about our cultural bias and the psychology of our choices (what is considered important and what is unimportant; what is precious, what is disposable). My curiosity lies not so much with the objects themselves, but with the mysterious process that I see as a kind of unconscious misdirection. It begs certain questions: What is it that causes certain types of objects to be seen as falling outside the range of our aesthetic consideration, and not others? What do they have in common? And what do they reveal about the things we do value?

Because of the pervasiveness of its use, the smartphone seemed the perfect tool to seek out answers to these questions. By pointing out such objects we are able to define more clearly the boundaries of acceptability and value and how such invisible lines are enforced.

Adrienne Borkowski is a multimedia artist based in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. Trained in metalsmithing, she is a graduate of the Cleveland Institute of Art.

As a trained metalsmith, Adrienne abides by an exacting integrity of materials and craftsmanship. The infrastructure of a piece is finished as thoroughly as the anterior. Those principles extend to the subject matter of the sculptures.

Adrienne works intuitively with offerings from the natural world. In some cases, the creation of a piece continues over several years, waiting for just the right treasure to be provided by the woodlands of Appalachia.

A similar process guides Adrienne's aesthetic decision-making. Through faithful observation of her surroundings, from interactions between friends, human or creature, to the subtle colors found in the winter landscape, Adrienne culls guidance from the natural world. Her creative process is as quiet and deliberate as the sculptures it yields.

Adrienne hopes that one might feel the steady harmony found in the natural world while spending a moment with her work.

It is about the beads of air waiting under the ice
and the smell of newly thawed soil.

It is about homesickness for a kinship that is never absent.

It is about the first vireo who wrapped a reed around a branch
and the trust of all of the broods that followed.

STATEMENT:

In our 21st century world, where uber-consumerism has been combined with fast and efficient delivery systems, a package can arrive at your door within mere days of the final stroke of a computer key. Often the contents of that package are surrounded by polystyrene, known in its extruded form as styrofoam. This product serves a useful, protective purpose while the package is in transport, but once that purpose has been fulfilled, the styrofoam has very little further use. It is non-biodegradable. It is increasingly abundant as a form of litter in the outdoor environment, particularly along shores and waterways, and also in increasing quantities in our oceans.

These pieces of cast-off styrofoam packaging are the raw materials of my work. Within the shapes and negative spaces of this now useless packaging material, the ghosts of a toaster oven or ceiling fan may still linger. For me, the shapes and spaces tell different stories. Within each piece is the element of change and surprise. Spatial relationships change continuously, with endless possibilities. As more material is added and finishes applied the ultimate character of the piece emerges. Like any artist, my goal is to engage viewers; to challenge them to let the sculpture speak and to discover, perhaps, the ghosts that lie hidden within.

STATEMENT:

It is difficult to consider one's existence through memory, or lack thereof, without considering one's non-existence. As such, mortality is a predominant topic throughout my work. These sculptures begin to explore the overwhelming journey of rediscovering who I am after having a near-death experience of emergency brain surgery. The discovery of experiencing Aphantasia and Severely Deficient Autobiographical Memory (SDAM) influenced the way that I create realizing that sketches, creating small models, references, and experimentation were vital to my studio practice. Currently, my work explores the more intimate attributes of Aphantasia and SDAM depicting themes of disassociation and weak life memories. Through the integration of materials such as found objects, steel, and textiles, and the use of text in the work emphasizes the effort to represent the intangible concept of lacking experienced daily. Through the sculptural medium, I am deciphering who and how I am.

STATEMENT:

I move clay as it moves me - fluidly we exchange places as master and servant. Clay's unseen potential is what draws me to it. Engaging in the processes that change it from formless dust and water to solid permanence is my passion. Clay is humble and bends to my will as it humbles me in kind. With Rodin and Michelangelo as inspirations, my figural work is constructed using clay-modeling techniques sculpting directly from live models. Wheel and hand techniques are then employed to create environments for the figures. I imbue my figures with feelings and opinions, borrowing from life, I then place them in environments that suit their dispositions. When more than one figure is presented the expressions become communicative, creating an interface of human connection. That, for me, is the allure of working with the figure. Pottery forms express through proportions, balance and harmony which resonate with our visual perception. There is a grace to the ideal form which might be diminished by color and glaze. Using methods I have developed, I approximate surfaces seen in the Black on Black Pueblo traditions, first by polishing the leather hard clay to a mirror shine, and then by using American Raku firing methods I imbed the pieces with black color. These characteristics allow the pot to be seen on its own merits as a sculptural form becoming its best self.

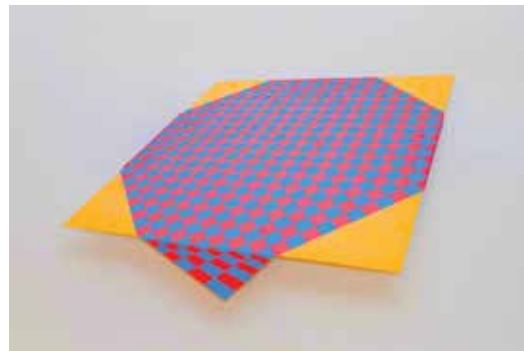

STATEMENT:

In observing “what is essential is invisible to the eye,” The Little Prince in Saint-Exupery’s story reminds us of our limited perception. What we’re seeing is only part of the story and can even be illusory – camouflaging or misdirecting our attention away from some of the more subtle and important aspects of what we are observing.

This evanescent quality of observation has been a lifelong curiosity for me. As a teenager, I was interested in magic, with its two simultaneous realities...what observers see and what’s ‘really going on.’ I see this gap between what is observed and what is hidden (or intentionally concealed) as a metaphor for how we experience the world, whether in media, marketing or even our understanding of each other and ourselves.

As a sculptor, although less involved with deceit, I’m deal with some of the same issues. The four pieces submitted reference these limits. For example, the wall sculpture, “Interior Glow,” appears to be a simple white box. But as one views it, a mysterious glow becomes apparent, the reflection of hidden florescent surface on the reverse side of the front panel. It is subtle at first, but becomes more apparent as one views it, although the source is impossible to see. “Checkered Tablecloth,” a trompe-l’oeil dimensional wall sculpture, plays with the boundaries between 2 and 3 dimensions. “The Gathering,” made from recycled plastic, has confetti-like elements embedded in a translucent panel, appearing to be referencing celebration until one realizes these are fragments of ocean waste. And “Thought Process,” suspended and slowly rotating, creates a moire effect which changes its shape as it rotates or one’s position changes. Beyond the literal gaps in perception, there are metaphoric issues at play. The fact that our perceptions of reality are limited and arguably missing much of the good stuff, underscores a central challenge in my work – changing the way we experience reality without completely abandoning it.

STATEMENT:

As a figurative sculptor, my goal is to use tangible forms to represent ideas which are too fleeting and complex to be represented directly. While I am drawn to the figure's expressively sensual form, I find it infinitely more meaningful when used as a tool for exploring the themes that recur in my work: the search for hope and spirituality, awe, imagination, isolation, and exhaustion.

To tell the story of these emotionally murky experiences, I find that elements of suggestion, personal symbolism, and myth open the sculpture to a far deeper range of experiential possibilities for the audience. I want viewers to feel as though they have stumbled upon characters in the midst of performing an unknowable rite; who the figures are and precisely what lives they have lead are as opaque as they are irrelevant. What matters is the visceral tug of the experience, the feeling that these gestures and adornments are invested with palpable spiritual gravity.

STATEMENT:

My art is a blend of Nature and Spirituality. An early interest in Tribal Art and Byzantine Art has long been the inspiration behind my work. Masks, totems, and sacred icons are highly expressionistic artifacts imbued with the energy of visible and invisible realms. For me they also symbolize the exciting textures of imagination and magic. I use natural elements like bamboo, seedpods, beach stones, seashells, and branches to turn abstract thoughts into visible ones in my wood and bamboo mosaics, paintings, and silverpoint drawings.

When I create a work in wood or bamboo nothing is preplanned, intuition guides me through the fog. I use the bandsaw to explore by experimenting with textures, discovering interesting segments of bamboo, or pleasing shapes of wood. I take note of where my attention is being pulled, and then follow, balancing and choosing from the infinite creative possibilities that present themselves.

A single pole of bamboo can be transformed into a work of wildly diverse components. I sometimes incorporate imprints of bamboo into my work. I make blocks by cutting node sections, either on an angle or sliced flat, to reveal unusual hidden designs. I hone these segments or blocks, dip them in paint, and press them onto a surface to create symbols or patterns. These segments can be used as beautiful sculptural elements in themselves.

My intention is always to expand both the material and the concept in an original and elegant way. I treat each piece in the composition with care, smoothing and refining the tesserae by hand with various knives, metal files, and sandpaper. I prefer a refined but not perfect finish to my work, with some tool marks desirable, an imprint of the artist's hand.

STATEMENT:

I take quotidian yet traditional objects, images, or environments and reinvent them through repetitive and tactile practice. This allows me to implant the intricacy and repetition of human acts and emotions, responding to contemporary and historical issues of violence related to the community. Objects and landscapes I sensually revisit are artifacts of the past or environments embodying the unmonumental-ness of everyday life. They function as the silent landscape where isolation, solidarity, individual and community, material and emotion, inheritance, and discontinuity coexist.

A recent body of work represents the baskets or containers people used to share food to feed their community in life-threatening circumstances in contemporary protests and wars. Growing up in South Korea, which experienced sudden colonialism, wars, ideological divisions, economic crises, and rapid economic growth within a hundred years, I was always curious about the past of the surrounding environment and people. My work directs what connects us as a community when facing generational fragmentation and disconnection. So, I delved into history, personal artifacts, and memories imbued with intimate human emotion, provoking a sense of connection and belonging through the representation and reinvention of objects to commemorate humanness.

Meditation on the disappearance of ritualistic hands-on and sensorial processes, combined with nature, led curiosity about the self within the context of me to explore clay. I delve into its physicality and spirituality as a sensorial language to communicate the resilience and power of focusing on the process in representation.

STATEMENT:

I work concurrently on two distinct yet related bodies of work. In a series of portraits of my self and my immediate family, I record my sitters' likenesses while striving to reveal interior characteristics simultaneously. A series of portraits of my pregnant wife, for example, are at once about her dramatic physical transformation, as well as the emotional impact of her pregnancy following a decade of unexplained infertility. For me these portraits are reverential, documentary, and sometimes confrontational in both design and conceptual intent. In my narrative images, my goal is to develop interactions of figures (typically my wife and me) that suggest layers of content. These are arranged in the space of our shared studio, and explore a broader artist/model relationship as well as our personal relationship. I compose these pictures with the goal of engaging the viewer in dynamic design, using the lyrical positioning of figures, shifting perspective of architectural space, and strategic arrangement of pattern, texture, color and light. In developing all of my images, I work from a combination of direct observation and photographic sources. This allows me to fully explore an array of potential compositions, perspectives, and degrees of proportional distortion as I work, and is particularly useful in my investigation of illusory three-dimensional form and space. Although each subject is comprised of multiple visual sources, I intentionally obscure this process of compilation, attempting to create images that are seamlessly unified and convincingly real.

STATEMENT:

Early in my graduate study in sculpture I focused on ways forms interact. I spent years carving wood and stone, creating interconnected organic shapes. Eventually I started to draw some of the shapes on various kinds of papers with a fine point pen and black ink. The tactile feel of the paper and the process of applying the ink is sensuous as is the feel of wood or stone when shapes grow under carving tools.

A chance visit to an exhibit of ancient Torahs, Qu'rans and old Biblical manuscripts resonated deeply with me: the beauty and meaning in patterns of sacred texts of inky intertwined calligraphy. I surrendered myself to where these experiences led me.

A trip to the alHambra in Grenada, Spain, was where I first became aware of the beauty of Islamic-influenced art and architecture. Later I was fortunate to be able to travel to Turkey, Iran, Lebanon, Central Asia and Italy where I found endless inspiration.

I discovered how pattern and intense repetition can be meditative and quiet, almost minimalist.

I want every mark to matter, the way every cell in a tree grows, with purpose, nothing random nor extraneous. To have as much control as possible I have opted for the finest pen nibs made. I use a technical pen with India ink and occasionally a little pencil shading. The choice of paper is critical to the development of the image. The variations of white and the different surface textures behind the marks give me enough of a pallet with which to challenge myself.

As forms emerge, there is something in the unknowing of all the possibilities that is both humbling and hopeful as my own visual sensitivity grows.

This mark making, the shapes, forms and textures, celebrates our efforts to understand, to document and to enrich our world. Pattern, space and shape are the letters, the verbs and the nouns of my visual language and process is the dance between idea and form.

While in graduate school as a ceramics major at the Maryland Institute College of Art, I began working in the printmaking studio making intaglio etchings and drypoints. She began making handmade books in 2019, starting with her photographs and incorporating letterpress and handwritten text. She earned her MFA from Maine Media College in 2020. 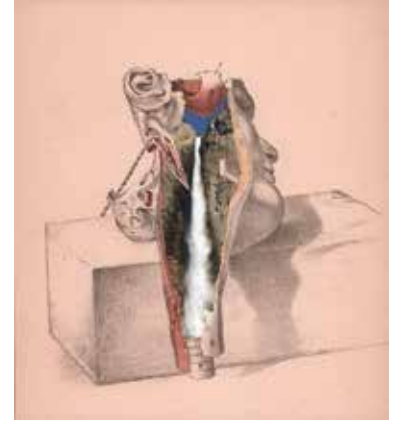

STATEMENT:

As a figurative painter, I use my work as a vehicle for exploring masculinity, idolatry, desire, and identity. My obsession with figurative art was born from a lonely childhood where connecting with others was easier said than done, and controlling social interactions by drawing people a more welcome route than talking to them sometimes. My work addresses the ubiquitousness of mass produced packaging, highly manufactured refuse that permeates our daily lives and environments in such a powerful way that we hardly notice it anymore. By individualizing these pieces of discarded packaging - coffee cups, soda cups, and other fast food containers, I hope to transform the mundane object into something entirely unique and alluring. These paintings function as painstaking meditations and documentations on the pervasive commercialization of my home town landscape.

As a collage artist she explores diverse visual ideas and seeks distinctive materials and innovative ways to express each theme. After earning a degree in Fine Art from Douglass College, Rutgers University, she has lived, studied and created art in NYC, Northern New Jersey, Paris, and in Jerusalem, where she taught art in special education programs for eight very eventful years.

In 2018 she joined the Philadelphia art community and appreciates the warm welcome she has received. Florence has become a juried member of Da Vinci Art Alliance, CFEVA, Tri-State Artists Equity, ARTsisters, MCGOPA, Main Line Art Center, and InLiquid Gallery which hosted her 40 year retrospective.

She has exhibited her art in over 30 solo shows, including among other venues, the Newark Museum, Jersey City Museum, Johnson & Johnson Headquarters and The Delaware Contemporary. Most recently she created a site-specific installation, STRIPES ESCAPE, on view for four months in 2023 at The Delaware Contemporary, in Wilmington, DE.

STATEMENT:

I love collage - it's my primary medium. I create my own distinctive collage materials and search for innovative ways to express a range of different subjects. I love the excitement that comes with the collage process: the chance placement of elements and the accidental discoveries that lead me to explore new visual ideas. I enjoy the balance I can achieve between spontaneity and control, between my emotional and my intellectual responses.

Over the last ten years, I have been fascinated by STRIPES. To date, I have created more than 100 compositions about stripes in ongoing 2-D and 3-D series. My collage materials include details from photographs I take of people wearing striped clothing. The Inked Growth Series are abstract collages, composed on three separate layers: square cropped photo of stripes, alcohol ink papers, and transparent mylar. I am intrigued by how rigid patterns of parallel lines can appear organic and sensuous.

My 3-D collages have led to the creation of site specific installations which are multi-paneled compositions produced on large format printers and connected by stripes formed with strips of buckram or heavy vinyl materials. The most recent manifestation was installed for four months, in 2023, in the Draper Gallery at The Delaware Contemporary (too large for this submission). Other smaller works, were installed at the Chester County Art Center and at Swarthmore Borough Hall.
