For 58 years, *Art of the State* has been telling Pennsylvania stories through the creations of contemporary artists and craftspeople. We are grateful for the creators who submitted 2,344 entries, and to the jurors who selected the 94 works in this year's exhibition.

Art of the State has always highlighted the techniques and perspectives of established and emerging artists but this year's participants, who range in age from 20 to 84, display a particularly wide breath of experiences. This representation of multigenerational views provides visitors the opportunity to explore ideas through a variety of lenses.
