

## OBJECTS FROM THE COLLECTION: A SCAVENGER HUNT



### GEORGE WASHINGTON

George Washington's image was reproduced on a wide variety of objects, from decorative bowls to banners, to honor of the nation's first president. Find images of Washington on the following objects in the gallery.

For centuries, people have collected keepsakes from loved ones or people they admire. Some of these items could be considered unusual today. Find an unusual personal memento from this Founding Father and the first president of the United States - a lock of George Washington's hair.

### FLAGS

*Birth of Our Nation's Flag*, painted c. 1893 by Charles H. Weisberger (1856–1932), shows Betsy Ross presenting her supposed first rendition of the nation's flag, the Stars and Stripes. The number of stars and stripes were chosen to represent the original number of colonies. How many stars are on this version of the national flag? 13 stars

The painted scene on the 1st Continental Regiment Flag shows a hunter trying to trap and subdue a tiger, which is presumably symbolic of America's resistance to British authority during the Revolutionary War. What is the meaning of the Latin phrase "Domari Nolo" at the bottom of the flag?

### LIBERTY BELL

This bell was cast in 1965 for the Pennsylvania exhibit at the New York World's Fair. It is a full-size replica of the original Liberty Bell. Take a closer look at the inscription on the bell.

Complete the verse from Leviticus 25:10. "Proclaim LIBERTY throughout all the Land unto all the Inhabitants thereof."

Complete the inscription that indicates who ordered the bell. "By Order of the ASSEMBLY of the Province of PENNSYLVANIA for the State House in Philada."
